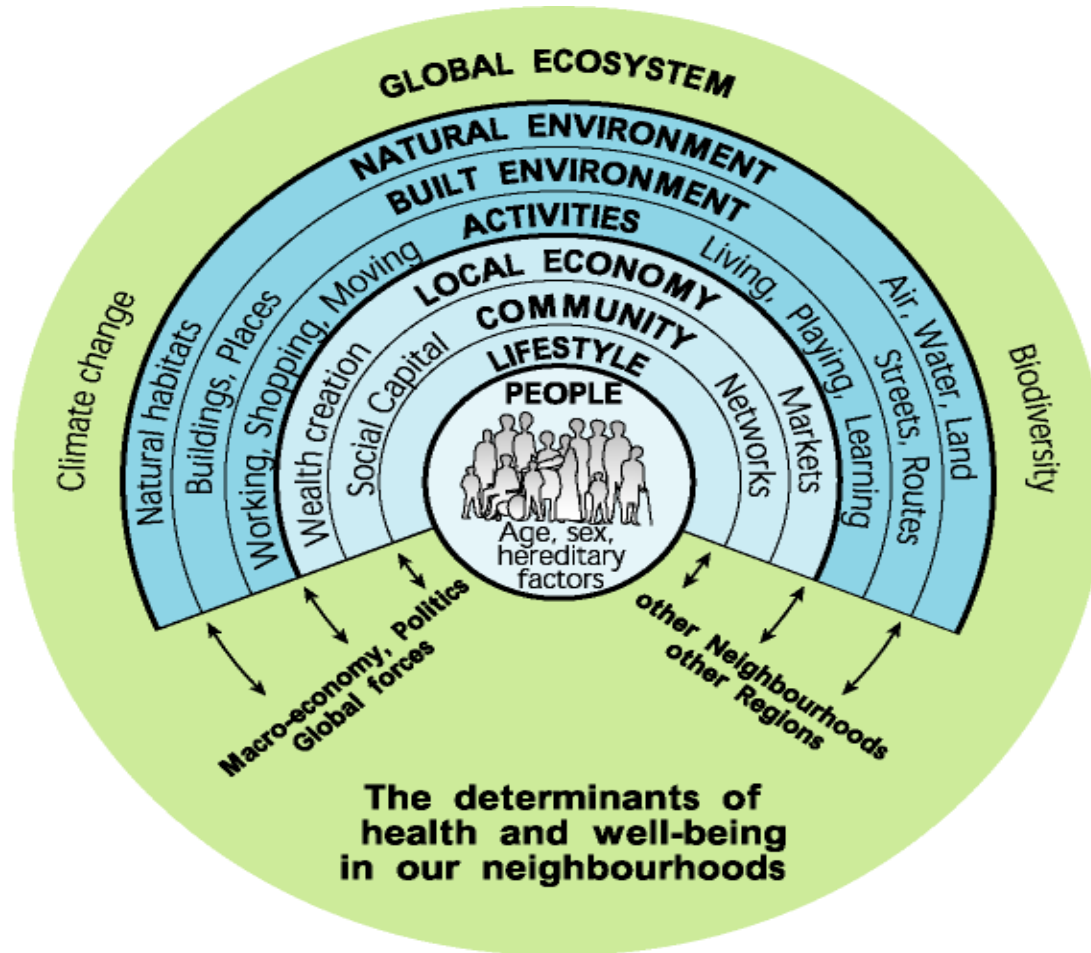

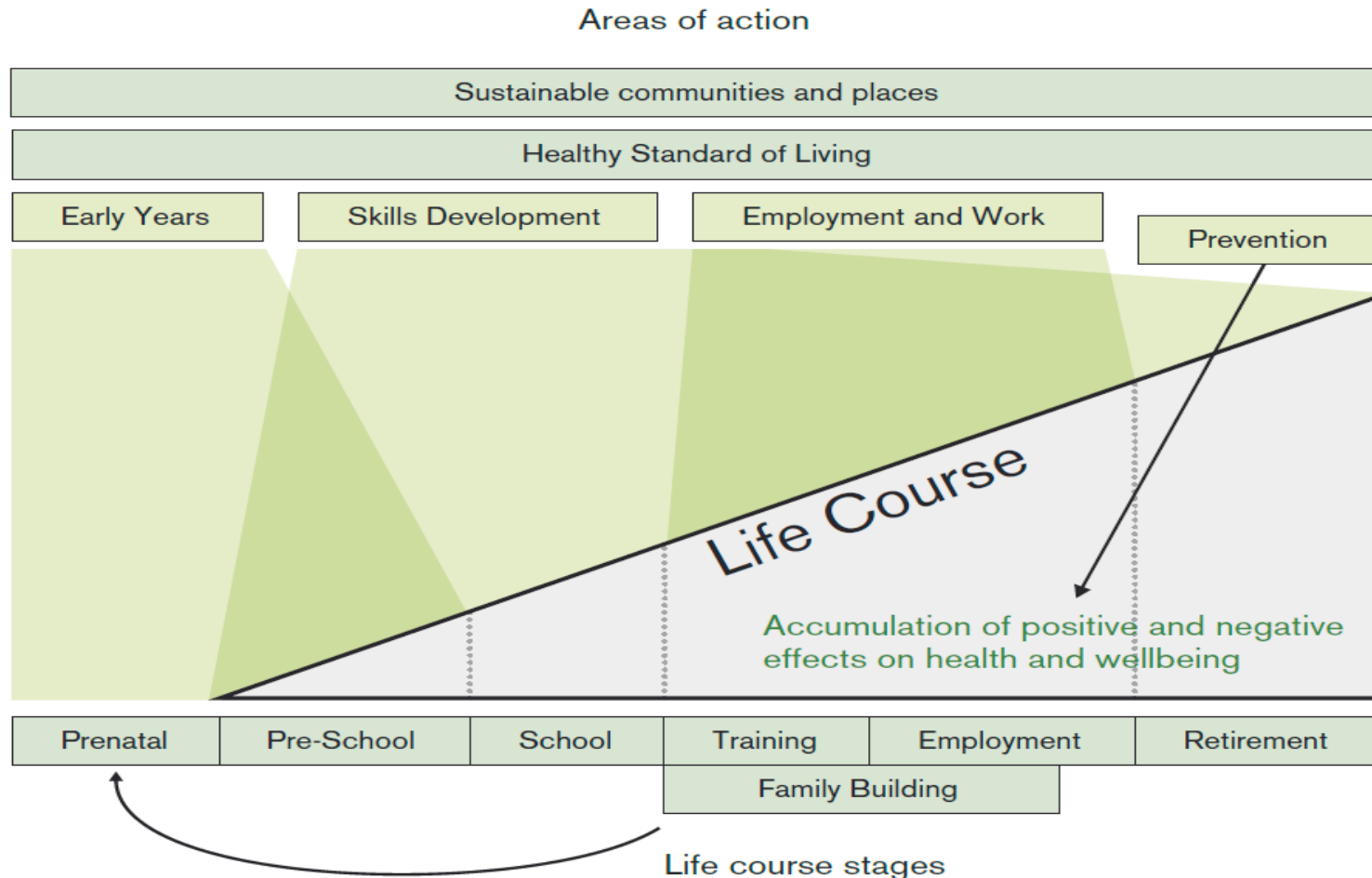
- Significantly better than England value
