## Performance Report Month 6

### Introduction

This paper provides comments against those indicators where interpretation and action is appropriate.

### Healthcare Acquired Infection

HCAI is now split on NHS number and GP practice between Merton and Sutton. There have been no cases of MRSA diagnosed in 2012/13 so far in Merton patients. Twelve cases of C.Difficile have been diagnosed in Merton patients in the period April-August 2012 (5 at St George's, 2 at St Helier, 5 to other Trusts).

Overall Trust performance for MRSA shows that Epsom and St Helier and Kingston Hospitals are on Red (ESH 4 cases so far against annual performance target of 4 cases, Kingston 1 case so far against annual target of 1) and St George's Healthcare on Amber (2 cases).

For C. Difficile, Epsom and St Helier and St George's Healthcare are on Red (ESH 46 YTD, 52 annual, SGH 37 YTD, annual 52) and Kingston is on Amber (10 YTD, annual 15)

### Cancer Waiting Times

Cancer Waiting Times remain mainly on target. Where they are not small numbers mean that there is no action at this stage.

### GP Written referrals to Hospital and First Out Patient Attendances

All performance data relating to outpatient referrals and appointments are in excess of target at PCT level for YTD, although there was some improvement in September. MCCG is advised to review practice data to assess the accuracy of the split and whether practice level positions can provide a basis for action.

### Referral to Treatment Times

18 week waiting times are still not being achieved at St George's Healthcare, where at a provider level admitted performance Red rated at 84%.

### Choose and Book

This remains consistently below target.

### Access to dental services

These are PCT level figures. The below target position is consistent with 2011/12.

### Smoking Quitters

Performance continues to be well below target. This service is part of a tender which will set challenging targets for 2013/14.

### Chlamydia Screening

Chlamydia testing and diagnosis levels are low in Merton compared with Sutton. This is being challenged with the service provider, particularly to ensure that data is complete.

### Breast Feeding Prevalence

MCCG performance is marginally below target at Q2, and coverage (the percentage of babies for whom type of feeding is known, is also below target). Prevalence remains low in Sutton which means that at PCT level prevalence is also below target. A review is underway to assess support to mothers against best practice guidance and identify actions that need to be taken to improve.
